## Lois's recipes from the progressive dinner



### **Baked Zucchini Sticks**

#### Ingredients:

3 medium zucchini, sliced into 3" x ½" sticks

1 large egg white

1/3 cup seasoned whole wheat bread crumbs

2 tbsp grated Pecorino Romano cheese

Cooking spray

¼ tsp garlic powder

Salt

Fresh pepper

#### Directions:

Pre heat oven to 425 F.

In a small bowl, beat egg whites and season with salt and pepper. In a ziplock bag, place bread crumbs, garlic powder and cheese and shake well. Spray cookie sheet with cooking spray and set aside.

Dip zucchini sticks into eggs then into bread crumb and cheese mixture, a few at a time and shake to coat. Place the breaded zucchini in a single layer and spray more cooking spray on top. Bake at 425 F for 20-25 minutes, or until golden brown. Serve with ½ cup marinara sauce for dipping.

### **Quick Marinara Sauce**

Ingredients:

1 tsp olive oil

2 cloves garlic, smashed

2 8 oz cans crushed tomatoes

1 small bay leaf

2 tbsp chopped fresh basil

Salt and fresh pepper to taste

Directions:

In a medium pot, heat olive oil over medium heat. Add garlic and sauté until golden, being careful not to burn. Add crushed tomatoes, salt, pepper, oregano, basil and bay leaf. Stir and reduce heat to low. Cover and let simmer about 20 minutes.



## Stuffed Cheesy Bread

### Ingredients:

1 Italian loaf, about 12 inches long

1 stick butter, melted

1/8 cup olive oil

3 tsp minced onion

2-3 cloves garlic, grated

1 tbsp Dijon mustard

3 tsp chopped parsley

12 oz grated cheese, swiss or any kind you prefer



Directions:

Pre heat oven to 350 F.

Mix the melted butter, olive oil, onion, garlic, mustard, and parsley in a bowl.

Cut the bread into cubes with X slices, without cutting all the way through the bottom crust.

Pour the butter, onion, garlic mixture carefully into those X cracks using a small spoon and over the top of the bread. Fill those delicious cracks with the grated cheese.

Wrap the entire loaf with foil, sealing the sides properly and bake for 15-20 minutes. Remove from the oven and unwrap. Bake for another 10 minutes until the cheese is melted and gooey.



## **Fig and Goat Cheese Won Ton Cups**

### Ingredients:

12 baked won ton cups, cooled

3 ounces goat cheese, at room temperature

2 tablespoons fig jam

1 sprig of thyme

### Directions:

Place a little fig jam at the bottom of each baked won ton cup. Add a dollop of the room temperature goat cheese on top of the jam. Add a leaf of thyme to the top.

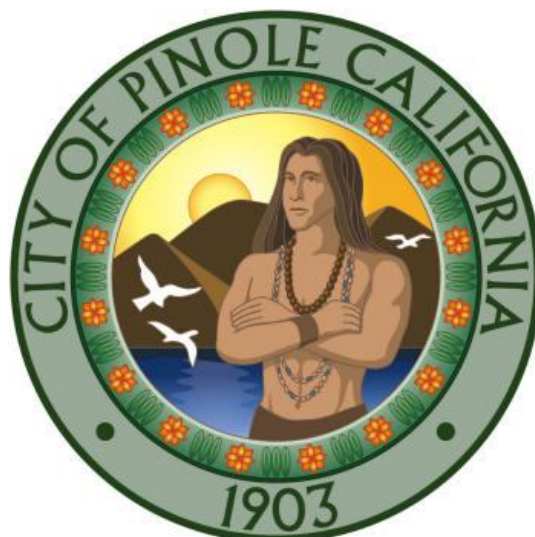


## **BCR Bonus Outing September 2013**

## Linda's Famous Carrot Cake

### Ingredients:

2 cups sugar

1 ¼ cups cooking oil

2 cups flour

4 eggs

1 can drained pineapple

2 cups grated carrots

2 teaspoons baking soda

1 teaspoon cinnamon

½ teaspoon nutmeg

½ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

½ cup crushed walnuts

½ cups raisins

### Directions:

Mix everything! Pour into greased pan.

Bake at 350 F for 45 minutes in convection oven, or 350 F for 1 hour in conventional oven.

Watch for over baking!

½ cube of margarine, melted

4 ounces cream cheese softened

# The Gilmore Car Museum: Heaven on Earth?

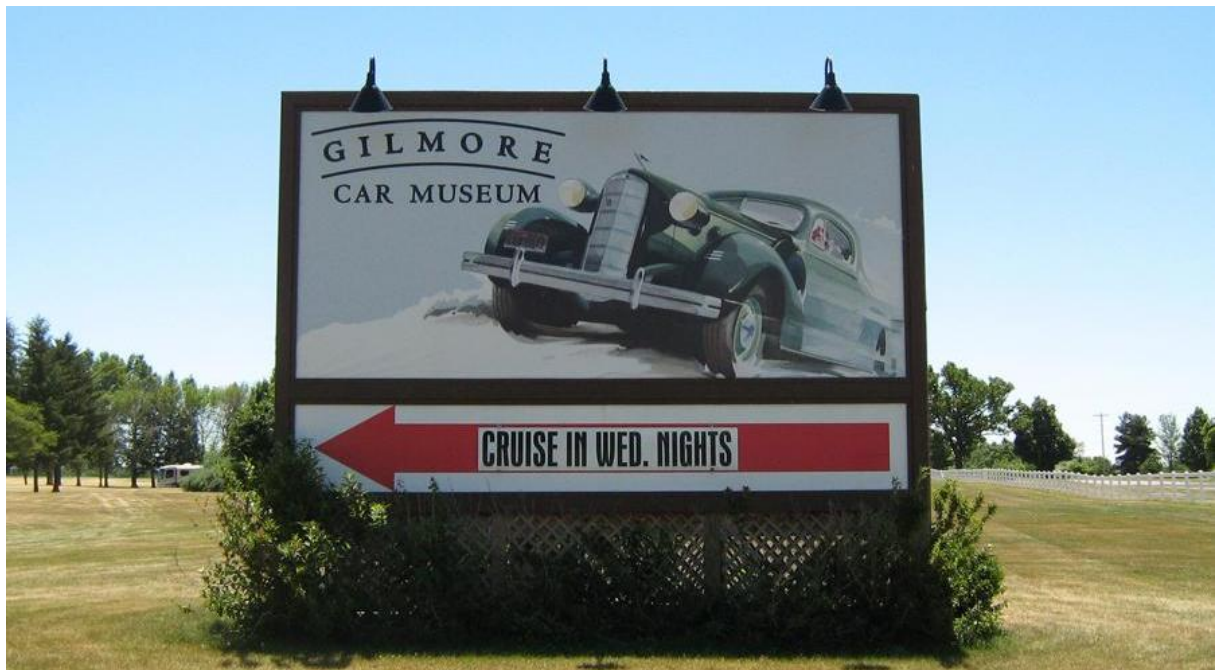
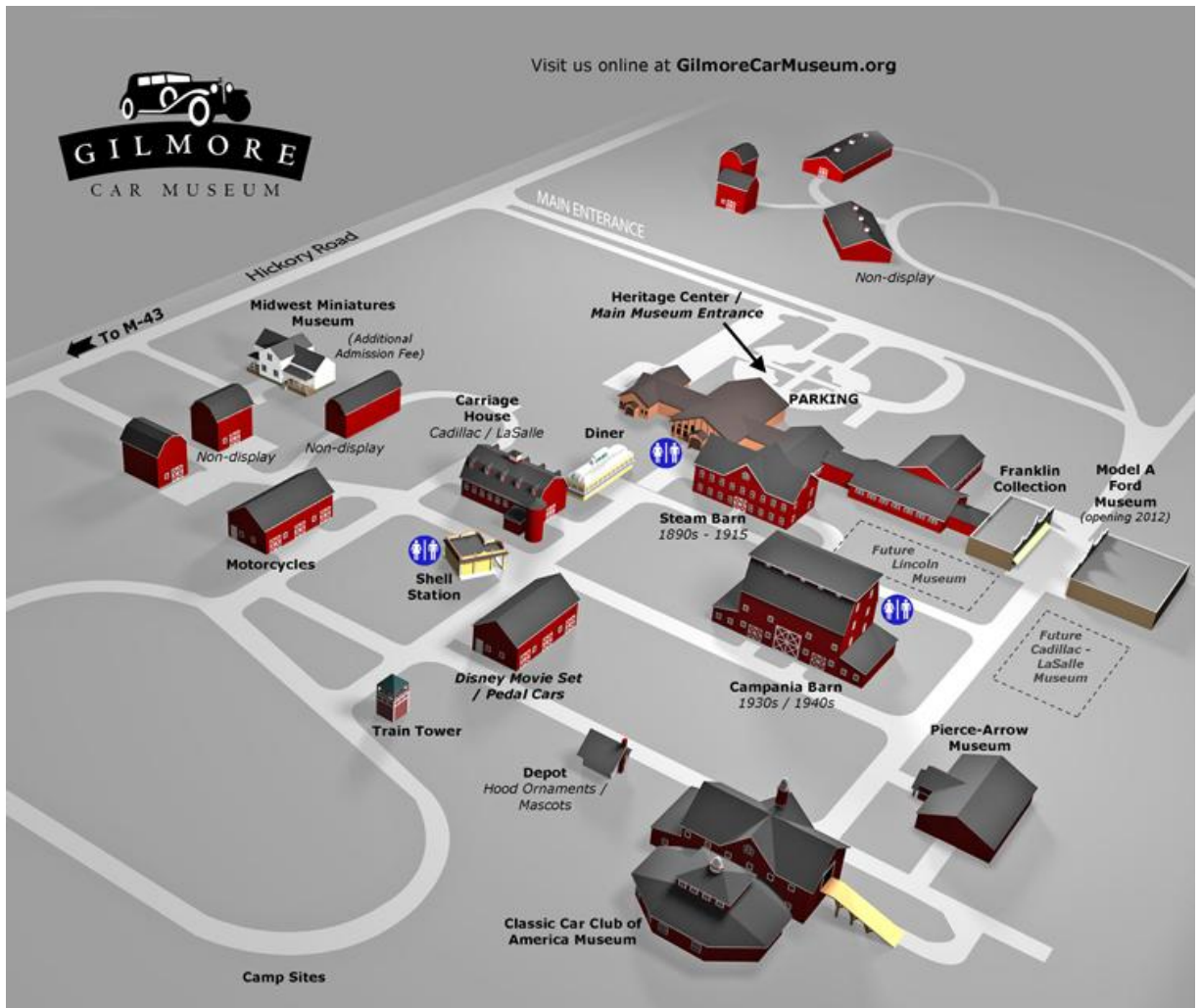

The Gilmore was started by Donald and Genevieve Gilmore in 1963 when Genevieve gave her husband an old Pierce Arrow to fix up as a hobby in his retirement. Now I always thought the Gilmore family made their fortune in oil (“Roar with Gilmore”) but Genevieve’s family actually started Upjohn pharmaceutical company. With the restoration of the old Pierce Arrow, Donald decided to do a few more and he needed a place to restore and keep his growing car collection. He ended up buying about 90 acres of farmland and built these huge beautiful barns to store his cars in. If there is such a place as heaven I couldn’t imagine it would be more wonderful than this place. Rolling green grass and farmland with white fences with huge red barns, an old gas station, and a diner from the forties are on the property. They also have a complete Ford dealership circa 1930 with every kind of Model A inside. When we were there they had started to build an authentic Cadillac dealership to house their collection of Cadillacs.

It was truly a wonderful place with all kinds of classic cars from Duesenbergs to Metropolitans, if you ever get a chance or are in the area you have to go. I have been to many car museums but this place was the best by far, so if you are ever in the area you must go.

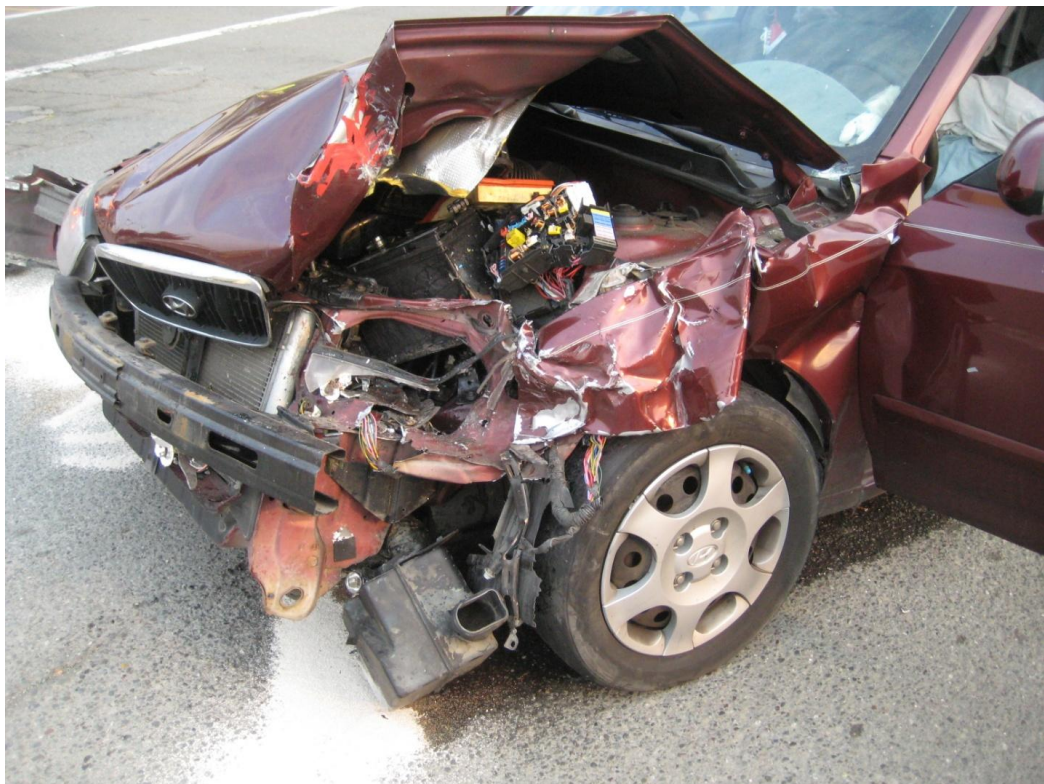
