Mr. London passed away (much too young) a little over a century ago, but not before he had built an impressive ranch near the enclave of Glen Ellen. The ranch grounds are now a California State Park and the background for our April event.

We met in Santa Rosa and caravanned southwest on the Valley of the Moon highway and reached the park without incident or breakdowns, an accomplishment in and of itself!
