



GRANITE MOUNTAIN SHOTS....MY PILGRIMAGE

The Granite Mountain Hotshots were a group of firefighters based in Prescott, Arizona. There are many Hotshot groups around the country, even another group based in Prescott. The Granite Mountain Hotshots were, however, the only hotshot group in the country supported by a municipality.

Yarnell is a small town about twenty-eight miles southwest of Prescott. A lightning fire started west of there on June 28, 2013. The Granite Mountain Hotshots were mobilized and made the trip to Yarnell on the 30th. They had just finished fighting another relatively minor fire just south of Prescott.

Tragically, due to shifting winds, the Hotshots were trapped in a box canyon and perished. They were trying to reach a ranch just a few hundred yards east of the site, but the flames blocked their escape. Nineteen brave souls lost their lives in the worst firefighting loss of life since 9/11.

There is a trail right off of Highway 89 just south of Yarnell that honors the Hotshots. An arduous workout, one climbs a steep trail, goes through a pass, and descends to the Memorial site. The return is the reverse, so it involves seven miles and about 1800 feet of climbing.







On a hill in the Arizona Pioneers Cemetery the City of Prescott placed a Memorial that overlooks portions of Prescott. Nine of the nineteen Hotshots are interred there, but there is a marker and a flag for each man.









Two weeks before Yarnell there was another fire, dubbed the Doce Fire, that had threatened Prescott from the west. The Granite Mountain Hotshots were instrumental in preventing the fire from spreading into Prescott proper. Interestingly, there is a tree called the Giant Alligator Juniper on the western slope of Granite Mountain. This particular tree is the largest and oldest Alligator Juniper in the country...over two thousand years old. (These trees are called Juniper Alligators because the skin of their trunks resembles the skin of an alligator). The Hotshots saved this tree on June 18, 2013. A few days later they went back to pose by this beauty.





The last part of my 'pilgrimage, if you will, to honor these brave souls was to hike to the site of this beautiful tree.







So, I hiked the hikes and visited the Memorial to these brave men, the youngest of which was only nineteen and the oldest, their leader Eric Marsh, was 43.

Alas, I wasn't done as yet paying homage to the Granite Mountain Hotshots. I read two books (both of which I recommend): <u>The Fire Line</u> by Fernanda Santos and <u>Granite Mountain</u> by Brenden McDonough. Brendon was the lone survivor, having been assigned the role of lookout.

And, of course, there is a movie: Only the Brave, starring Josh Brolin (as Eric Marsh) and Jeff Bridges as Mr. Willis, the supervisor of the group. It's a good movie....but it does take a few minor liberties with the actual events....I recommend reading the books before watching it!
