Friday was the cruise-in at the Plaza North Shopping Center in Petaluma. Fifties music was provided by XERB radio. Rock and Roll filled the parking lot, movie stars from the American Graffiti film were there to sign autographs (Candy Clark, Bo Hopkins and Lynne Stewart) and cars from the film were also present (the yellow 1932 coupe, 1955 Chevy, 1958 Impala, 1955 Thunderbird and the Citroen).
