The museum displays over 300 classic and antique cars, mostly domestic, ranging from the birth of the automobile through the mid-60s to early 70s. Seven of the many buildings were built by money donated by specific car groups such as the Model A Club of America, Classic Car Club of America, Cadillac-LaSalle Club, etc. There are more than just cars on display. There is a collection of pedal cars, hood ornaments (both original and specially made) and vintage motorcycles.

They even have a cruise-in every Wednesday night from May through September. These are just a few of the cars we enjoyed.





Leaving Hictory Corners, we drove to Dearborn so we could have a fresh start at the Henry Ford Museum the following day.

The museum is all contained in a single floor building with 40 foot ceilings that covers 9 acres and is jammed packed with all types and makes of cars, hot rods, race cars, trains, airplanes, a hydro-electric power plant, steam engines, antique furniture, guns, old electric appliances, and the list goes on and on. Also available in the area is the Greenfield Village, the Ford Rouge Factory Tour and the IMAX theatre.


