

A TRIP TO SAN FRANCISCO TO VISIT THE OCTAGON HOUSE AND THE ACADEMY OF ART AUTOMOBILE MUSEUM

An entourage of ten of us (Alden and Adela Hennings, Rich and April Kahnberg, Gail and Stan Sollid, Joan Costello, Lois Brooner, Keith Brumbley and this reporter, Terry Eggleston); all piled into a couple of vehicles and made the drive to our very own City by the Bay for a day of entertainment and education.

Gail Sollid is a docent at the Octagon House on Gough Street. She gave us our own personal tour of this amazing structure that was built in 1861 (actually across the street). It was saved from destruction in 1952 by National Society of the Colonial Dames of America: they moved it across the street and saw to its renovation.

The house is replete with furnishings and documents dating from the Colonial and Federal periods, right up through the Civil War.

I was amazed by the detailed woodwork, and even more so by the fact that I doubt if there were many Black and Decker power tools in colonial America.

I'm sure everybody had their favorite item, but I was particularly taken with the turn of the nineteenth century standing wall clock....still ticking and chiming away.

When the house was first built there was a stairway that went from the center of the ground floor to the cupola at



the top of the house. The windows to said cupola were opened on warm days to let out the hotter air and thus cool the house. Forgive the pun, but I thought that was really cool!

Our tour concluded with a stroll (and group picture) of the award winning garden on the north side of the house.

After this tour we walked a couple of blocks to Perry's on Union street for a nice lunch amongst pictures and posters of yesteryear....




