THE 1948 BUICK CONVERTIBLE NICKNAMED “TEN-TEN”

aka The Refueling Car

We discovered this article about a 1948 Buick while we were vacationing in Yuma, Arizona in February. We set out one afternoon in search of the Yuma City Hall and without too much trouble, we found it. What an impressive entrance with an airplane suspended from the second story ceiling and a beautiful 1948 Buick convertible straight ahead. It's a very interesting story that is briefly described in the article below. While we were at the Yuma City Hall, we found many pictures and writings of the amazing ordeal and a very informative video with actual footage of some of the exchange of gas, food, water, etc. that was passed from “Ten-Ten” to the airplane nicknamed “The City of Yuma”.





"The City of Yuma"

On Aug. 24, 1949 pilots Bob Woodhouse and Woody Jongeward set out to break the endurance record for continuous flight - 1008 hours - in a single-engine airplane. Their airplane was "The City of Yuma" and their goal - 1010 hours or "Ten-Ten" which became the nickname for the refueling car, a 1948 Buick convertible.

They ate, slept and went to the bathroom in that airplane. Three times a day the car kept pace with the plane as gas cans, hot water and towels for bathing, and warm meals were passed to the pilots from the car. Wives would sometimes be in the car and reach up to kiss their husbands.

Thousands of people came out in the evenings to watch the refueling. When the record was broken on Oct. 10, 1949, the whole city turned off all lights for one minute and then turned them on again at the moment the record was broken. **The new record - 1124 hours, almost 47 days - stood for nine years!**

With that record Yuma wanted to show that it had great year round flying weather to convince the US Army to reopen the airbase that was closed after WW11. The airbase reopened two years later.

You can see "The City of Yuma" and a replica of the "Ten-Ten" at Yuma City Hall, One City Plaza.
