15 Pounds of Buick in a 5 Pound Garage!

A few months ago Leo Ladner invited me down to his place to take a look at my 55' Buick to see if we could get it run a bit smoother and sort out some charging issues.

Leo has a neat little ranch with a big garage that holds a few vintage Buicks. I think you have all seen his beautiful 54' Super sedan, but he also has a '54 Buick Special coupe that is just as nice. Well the more I was there looking at my tired '55 compared to his beautiful '54 and what it would take to get my car anywhere near as nice as his – well, the wheels started turning....

I asked Leo if he was thinking about selling it and it turns out he was! Now the wheels were really turning! How could I come up with the money, would it fit in my garage (that was a big one!), if it wouldn't fit could I somehow modify the garage to get it too fit?

So I started measuring my garage. I have a typical two car garage and currently my Riviera takes up most of it along with a workbench and toolboxes, etc. With all my figuring I could see that I was going to be short about three measly inches! I was not going to let three little inches stop me so I commenced to digging up the backyard to put in a gravel foundation for a shed so I could move the toolboxes out. After digging a hole in the wet and heavy adobe clay I shoveled a yard and a half of pea gravel and leveled that out. Once the gravel was level I built a shed and put some heavy duty ply wood on the floor so it would support the heavy tool boxes. This all took about a month of working weekends and dodging the rain. Finally, everything was moved out of the garage and I could the now modify the back wall of the garage.

We cut out the sheet rock and backed the Riviera in to see how far into the wall we would have to go. It turned out it was just a couple of inches so we removed a 2x4 and part of the subfloor and it fit!



I did not think it was going to be possible to fit two rather large Buicks in my garage but with just a few inches to spare they are all in....Houdini would be proud!



But, alas, this article is not about mid-sixties Thunderbirds, but rather a private residence on Central Avenue. Jerry Wagner is the owner of this Arts and Crafts home designed by the famed architect Julia Morgan (I know this because Michelle told me so, and she knows about these things!):



The house is a time-warp...you feel a distinct disturbance in the space-time continuum when you step across the threshold and into the rooms on the first floor....a player piano, an antique radio, and really cool wall paper and décor.





Jerry then escorted us downstairs where he has assembled a 1940's style movie theater....we saw part of a flick with W.C. Fields...amazing how many adjectives that guy could use to describe his girlfriend, from "my little kumquat" to "my little chick-a-dee" and many others. We then saw a film on the famous ACD (Auburn, Cord, Duesenberg) museum in Auburn, Indiana.
